A Telluride home takes indoor living to the outer limits

The combinations that define this Telluride home—rustic materials and sleek angles—create a space that exists somewhere between the safety of home and the raw beauty of the natural world. Architect Bob Brotherton of Sunlit Architecture fused sandstone, cedar and mahogany with strong lines and sharp angles to forge a craftsman masterpiece.

The cantilevered deck winds the entire length of the home and seems to float among the aspens. A steeply pitched roof protects the deck from the elements while skylights let sunlight stream through, casting dramatic shadows and heating the space for entertaining in all seasons. ■■
